The Portland Insitute for Contemporary Art (PICA) explains its vision as international, intergenerational, interdisciplinary, and decidedly forward-thinking (even when those explorations look back in history). PICA is unique among institutions, believing that "everyone should have access to contemporary art." They are dedicated to keeping prices low and making it possible for all audiences to experience their boundary-pushing ideas and artwork. The organization also aims to provide direct access to artists.

The Institute has been an important part of Portland's art landscape since its founding in 1995 by Kristy Edmunds. In its early days, despite having no dedicated space, the organization found ways to exhibit and create experiences by using vacant warehouses and adapting makeshift venues. This led to the development of PICA's Time-Based Art (TBA) Festivals, which began in 2003 and have now grown to reach audiences of more than 26,000.

PICA found a home in 2011—a downtown space from where the organization can operate, but which also provides space to host performances and dinners, hold workshops, and mount exhibitions. This is all made possible through PICA's members and generous donors.

Shelly is excited to join as a board member and lend her support to elevating cutting edge, interactive, and ground-breaking art and culture that PICA brings to the local Portland art scene.

"We are at an infllection point in our community where we are examining the conscious and unconscious narratives and structures that have led us here today," Shelly explains.
